# 5 Update on other Authority projects

#### 5.1 Wholesale Advisory Group projects

- 5.1.1 The WAG has made the following progress on its projects:
  - Review of options to improve pricing efficiency in the spot market during periods when generators are net pivotal
    - The Authority released a consultation paper on 12 March 2014. Submissions are due on 22 April 2014.
  - b) Review of options to improve alignment of forecast and settlement prices
    - The Chair of the WAG presented recommendations to the Board on 4 December 2013. Authority staff are preparing an options paper for the Board to consider. It is expected to be presented to the Board at a meeting before 30 June 2014.
  - c) National Frequency Keeping Market

The WAG is considering the problem and possible options.

#### 5.2 Other projects

- 5.2.1 This section contains a brief update on other Authority projects potentially of interest to the RAG:
  - a) Retail data project

The Authority held a forum on 27 March 2014 to discuss the objectives, issues and next steps for the retail data project. About 60 people from generator/retailers, distributors, distributor consumer trusts and consumer groups attended. #### The next steps are:

- 1. consult on a preferred option for collecting data for retail monitoring
- 2. consult on a preferred option to give consumers access to their own consumption data
- 3. populate a trial tariff database with data from a region and run an end-to-end proof of concept with energy services providers.

The Authority is now working on developing the design of the options and will advise timeframes/milestones for the next steps soon.

#### b) Effects on competition of win-backs and saves

The Authority is taking a three-stage approach for the win-backs and saves project. The three stages are:

- 1. Problem definition: define the problem and provide a framework for identifying whether customer attraction and retention strategies have anti-competitive effects
- 2. Assess strategies: gather information on current strategies and use the framework to assess whether intervention is warranted
- 3. Intervention design: design any intervention considered warranted, and assess its costs and benefits.

Stage 1 is underway with regulatory economics experts from Sapere undertaking research and investigation on the local and international evidence on this issue.

Stage 2 is progressing well with both structured retailer interviews and a survey of consumers nearing completion.

The Authority plans to present a discussion paper covering Stage 1 and Stage 2 to the May Board meeting.
