Subject Obligations when providing consumption or tariff information (retail data

project)

For your information

On 1 February 2016, the Electricity Authority (Authority), as part of the retail data project, implemented Code amendments that require retailers to provide:

- consumers, or their authorised agent (agent), with the consumer's electricity consumption data
- generally available retail tariff plans to any person upon request.

The Authority has been contacted by concerned parties with a number of issues about retailers providing (or not providing) information.

Consumption information

As a minimum, retailers providing consumption information must comply with the Code and the Authority's procedures document.¹

Retailers should pay particular attention to the requirements, timeframes and manner in which information is released. Issues noted by the Authority include:

- information not being provided within five business days of the request. This timeframe is mandatory under the Code²
- incorrect format being provided. If EIEP 13A is requested, EIEP 13A must be used
- information not being provided electronically. Unless specified by the consumer or the agent, information should be provided electronically.

Agents should become familiar with the procedures document and Code requirements. The Authority encourages agents to use the EIEP transfer hub and EIEP 13C when requesting consumption information.³

Tariff information

Retailers are required to provide information about their generally available retail tariff plans to any person who requests the information.⁴ Issues noted by the Authority include:

- information not being provided within five business days of the request. This timeframe is mandatory under the Code
- information not being easily accessible, or being limited to a single address.

 Retailers can provide the information in a manner or format it typically uses (such as in the format and manner provided to Powerswitch and/or on its website)⁵
- information not being released until the person requesting it discloses why they want the information. This is not permissible under the Code.

The Authority will be consulting on a voluntary standard file format for the provision of tariff information later in 2016.
