
## MDAG review of spot market trading conduct provisions



## 15 March 2018



- Code prohibits conduct inconsistent with a 'high standard of trading conduct' (HSOTC)
- Safe harbours provide one way to comply
- But non-compliance with the safe harbours is not on its own a breach of a HSOTC (13.5B(2))

## So what is?

- HSOTC means (too) many different things to different people
- The words 'HSOTC' are too vague
- Guidelines (see project scope item (c))
  - can be used to explain how the Code will be applied to specific facts
  - can't be used to supply meaning that is missing from Code itself
- Rulings Panel needs to rule on Code (rather than Authority express views)
- The Authority should amend the Code to clarify the HSOTC rule by both:
  - defining what is a HSOTC
  - clarifying how safe harbours apply to frequently pivotal generators

- Trading conduct provisions should promote outcomes consistent with workable competition
  - Workably competitive market benchmark must be assessed:
    - in a NZ-wide wholesale market
    - over time and in terms of whether average prices are sustained above long run marginal cost (22 May 2017 HoustonKemp report)
  - On 2 June 2016 prices were \$4,300 in TP 36, \$188 in TP 37 and \$2,800 in TP 38; between 1 May 2016 and 30 June 2016 average daily prices were \$205 on 2 June and otherwise ranged between \$13.74 (11 June) and \$69.09 (4 May)
  - Incentives to increase transmission capacity making full use of existing HVDC?
