Request to present to the Innovation and Participation Advisory Group (IPAG)

The IPAG is exploring in more depth the concerns raised in submissions to the *Enabling mass participation* consultation relating to open or equal access to electricity networks. The IPAG are currently investigating the problem to set the direction of the project's analysis. The IPAG have asked the secretariat to contact a number of stakeholders as part of these investigations.

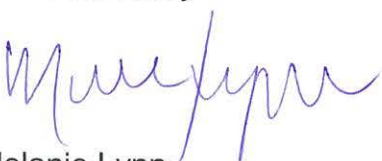
