OIA request: ICPs by 2017 Area Unit Boundaries

I refer to your email of 7 February 2019 in which you requested a dataset that specifies the following:

- the number of ICPs within each 2017 Area Unit Boundary
- the number of ICPs within each 2017 Area Unit Boundary that are monitored by a smart meter
- the number of ICPs within each 2017 Area Unit Boundary that relate to commercial enterprises.

Your request has been assessed in accordance with the Official Information Act 1982 (OIA).

Unfortunately the Authority does not hold the information you have requested, as we do not keep details of ICPs according to Area Unit Boundaries. Your request is therefore refused under section 18(g) of the OIA, on the grounds that the Authority does not hold the information you have requested, and we have no grounds for believing that it is held by any other agency or is more closely connected with the functions of any other agency.

You are entitled to ask an Ombudsman to investigate and review this decision to refuse your request. The address for contacting the Office of the Ombudsman is:

However, if you would like aggregate information about AMI (advanced metering infrastructure) meter penetration in New Zealand, you could access this through our EMI website (emi.ea.govt.nz), which I understand you have already been using. The EMI website includes information about ICPs with AMI meters broken down both by region, and by market segment (residential, commercial, industrial etc), which you have asked about.
